Recovery is For Every Person, Every Family, and Every Community

This September, the New York Council on Problem Gambling (NYCPG) celebrates National Recovery Month. Recovery is for everyone: every person, every family, and every community. Along with Faces & Voices of Recovery, this month is a time to celebrate the strides made by those in recovery from substance misuse, mental health issues, and problem gambling.

Because problem gambling is often a "hidden addiction", we must make it our high priority to talk about, prevent, educate and screen for issues. We know that many people can be impacted by problem gambling, including family members and communities. It takes the advocacy, support, and awareness of everyone to make sure that those looking for recovery have many pathways to get there.

NYCPG is working this September to bring awareness to problem gambling and the resources that are available so that everyone knows recovery is possible. There are a number of ways to get involved!

THE FACTS:

- Populations that are at higher risk of developing a gambling problem include veterans; older adults; the justice-impacted population; and college students
- People from different backgrounds, cultures, and experiences may not consider that some activities are gambling
- Two-thirds of those who gamble report that their mental health has suffered due to their gambling
- Brief 2-3 question screens can help detect problem gambling and only take a few minutes to administer

SCREENING:

Screening is a great place for an agency or provider to insert the topic of problem gambling into their practices. Because so many individuals are impacted by one person's gambling problem, anyone's mental and physical health could be impacted. In particular, the risk of suicide is higher among those who are struggling with their gambling. One in five people with a gambling problem will either attempt or die by suicide. Screening for problem gambling is suicide prevention.

Gambling Screening, Brief Intervention, Referral to Treatment (G-SBIRT) training is available to any agency that is interested in implementing gambling screening. G-SBIRT can help introduce gambling screening to different social and mental health issues for which people are already seeking help or treatment. In addition to screening, G-SBIRT also determines a level of risk for problem gambling and offers a relevant brief intervention to the client. Any agency that isn't screening for problem gambling is encouraged to introduce G-SBIRT.

RAISING AWARENESS:

As a community, we can work together to raise awareness about problem gambling and let people know that recovery is possible. NYCPG has created social media posts, recovery resource flyers, and screening materials to assist you in being part of the recovery community.
