

Guidance for OASAS Gambling Designated Programs Reimbursement

- OASAS Gambling Designated providers are eligible for reimbursement for individual, group, couples and/or family counseling for anyone who is presenting for treatment services who has been adversely affected by gambling harms. These funds are provided by OASAS to be issued through the NYCPG as a payor of last resort. One of the following circumstances should be present in order for the provider to request reimbursement for care:
 - High Deductible
 - o No Insurance
 - Clinical determination is made, documented in chart and justified in portal for requesting reimbursement from NYCPG/PGRC
 - Client does not want to utilize their insurance

Reimbursement rates are as follows:

<u>Procedures for requesting reimbursement:</u>

• The treatment provider shall complete the reimbursement form with the required client information and session data.

- o First 2 letters of client first name, first 2 letters of client last name
- Client DOB
- Last 4 numbers of clients SS #
- Client sex at birth
- o Admission date
- Session dates/length
- Forms must be completed by the 7th day of the following month, in which the services were provided to receive timely payment. Later reimbursement forms will be accepted but will delay payment. Forms must be submitted within 6 months of the date of the treatment sessions.
- If a client is admitted with a primary substance use disorder and is being treated for gambling harms as a secondary, the provider is not eligible for this reimbursement

Clinical documentation requirements

 Providers should follow all of the requirements for providing outpatient problem gambling services as outlined in the OASAS Part 822 General Service Standards for Substance Use Disorder Outpatient Programs and Part 857 Problem Gambling Treatment and Recovery Services.

Reporting requirements:

- Providers must continue to report in the G-CDS for those admitted with a primary concern related to gambling harms.
- During OASAS Certification Program Reviews, providers must be able to show clinical documentation and reporting on G-CDS that match the reimbursement claims submitted to NYCPG

Program information required to be submitted to NYCPG

- All OASAS providers shall provide and update their information in the portal as requested by the OASAS Treatment Coordinator at NYCPG.
- An executed subcontract
- Conflict of Interest Form
- W-9
- Direct Deposit information is preferred method of reimbursement, but a check can be issued
